# 1. ANNOUNCEMENT

The Australian Superbike Championship (hereafter called "ASBK") will conduct Round 1 of the Championship as part of the Superbike World Championship, Grand Ridge Brewery Australian Round and will be conducted under the conditions outlined in the ASBK Sporting Regulations.

This Competitor Information Kit will supplement the ASBK Sporting Regulations and should provide competitors with all the additional information they require for ASBK Round 1.

















#### 2. CIRCUIT DESCRIPTION

Phillip Island Grand Prix Circuit is located approximately 140km SSE of the Melbourne CBD and approximately 160km from Tullamarine Airport. The Phillip Island Grand Prix Circuit is located on Back Beach Road, Phillip Island. The Circuit is approximately 4.445km in length and the direction of racing is anti-clockwise.

The FIM Licences that will be accepted for The Event are Annual International Circuit Racing Meetings Licence and One Meeting International Circuit Racing Meetings directly linked to the IMN-NMFP for the Round.

#### AUSTRALIAN SUPERBIKE CHAMPIONSHIP

Three (3) races of twelve (12) laps for ASBK Superbike motorcycles complying with the ASBK Sporting Regulations All race results will count towards the Australian Superbike Championship.

# • AUSTRALIAN SUPERSPORT CHAMPIONSHIP

Three (3) races of ten (10) laps for ASBK Supersport motorcycles complying with the ASBK Sporting Regulations All race results will count towards the Australian Supersport Championship.

# • AUSTRALIAN SUPERSPORT 300

Three (3) races of eight (8) laps for ASBK Supersport 300 motorcycles complying with the ASBK Sporting Regulations All race results will count towards the Australian Supersport 300 Championship.

#### 5. ENTRIES

Entries will open forthwith via Ridernet on 11th January 2024 and will close on Friday 2nd February 2024.

<u>PLEASE NOTE:</u> entries must be received (and accepted) by <u>Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> January 2024</u> to be listed in the official event program. Entries received after this date will NOT be listed in the official event program.

The lodging of an Entry is not a guarantee of entry into the race or for practice or qualifying.

# 9. ENTRY FEES

The entry fee for Australian Superbike will be \$900 (including GST). The entry fee includes:

- The hire of a timing transmitter
- The hire of a 3m x 3m section of an undercover marquee bay in the WorldSBK Paddock
- Power supply

An additional 3m x 3m undercover marquee space may be purchased via Ridernet for a fee of \$545 including GST). If you wish to be placed next to another competitor, please indicate in the relevant question in Ridernet.

Not all requests can be accommodated and may result in Superbike competitors being relocated to the National Paddock Area in order to fulfil the request.

The entry fee for Australian Supersport will be \$875 (including GST). The entry fee includes:

- The hire of a timing transmitter
- The hire of a section of a permanent shed in the National Paddock area or a 3m x 3m undercover marquee bay if there is insufficient space also located in the National Paddock area
- Power supply

The entry fee for Australian Supersport 300 will be \$770 (including GST). The entry fee includes:

- The hire of a timing transmitter
- The hire of a section of a permanent shed in the National Paddock area or a 3m x 3m undercover marquee bay if there is insufficient space also located in the National Paddock area
- Power supply

Additional space may be purchased via Ridernet for a fee of \$545 including GST. If you wish to be placed next to another competitor, please indicate in the relevant question in Ridernet.

# 9.1 LATE ENTRY FEES

Entries received after the close of entry date may be accepted at the discretion of the promoter and ASBK Management Team. Should the promoter accept the late entry, the late entry fee of \$175 (inclusive of GST) will be added to the standard entry fee. Late entries will not be listed in the Official Event Program.

The entry fee is non-refundable except:

- In the case of abandonment or postponement of the meeting by the promoter.
- In the case of entrants whose bikes are withdrawn by written advice to the ASBK Race Secretary or ASBK Management, no later than three weeks before the first day of the meeting. A medical certificate MUST be received if a rider withdraws less than 10 days before the first day of the meeting.
- If a refund is granted, \$20 of the entry fee will be withheld for administrative costs and all credit card and processing fees will not be refunded.

Please Note: Competitors who withdraw from the Race Meeting will <u>not</u> be entitled to the allocated passes listed in point 16.

# 16. PASSES (CREDENTIALS)

Each accepted entrant or competitor in Australian Superbike, Supersport and Supersport 300 will receive credentials for five (5) persons, one (1) car park pass for parking in the infield and one (1) working vehicle pass (no cars).

Competitors who require more than the five event credentials (One (1) x Rider and Four (4) x Crew) issued as part of your entry fee for working purposes (ie. additional crew members) should email <a href="mailto:eventadmin@phillipislandcircuit.com.au">eventadmin@phillipislandcircuit.com.au</a> with the First Name, Last Name, Email Address (unique), Date of Birth (DD/MM/YYYY) of each additional crew member. Pass type and pricing is still to be finalised and will be notified on receiving your application for additional passes.

The maximum number of Pit Crew who may proceed to Pit Lane while their rider is participating in practice, qualifying, or racing is four (4) people for Australian Superbike, Supersport and Supersport 300. Refer to ASBK Sporting Regulations for Support Crew licencing requirements.

Should any entrant or competitor be found to have accepted credentials for the meeting and not made a bona fide attempt to practice and/or compete in the races, the matter will be reported to ASBK Management Team and/or ASBK Race Direction for further action.

Dorna WSBK require all team members receiving one of your allocated passes to be applied for individually. Generic passes will not be available in 2024. Please submit your Team Member Accreditation form via email to <a href="mailto:eventadmin@phillipislandcircuit.com.au">eventadmin@phillipislandcircuit.com.au</a> no later than 31 January 2024. Please ensure that details are completed clearly, and the same email address is NOT used more than once.

Credentials can be collected at the Accreditation Centre situated near Gate 2 at the Phillip Island Grand Prix Circuit at times nominated in the Final Instructions.

#### 16.1 SBK PIT IN APP

The SBK Pit In App will allow pass holders to validate their credential and sign the relevant Dorna waivers electronically. All Pass holders will receive an email from WorldSBK Web Portal outlining the steps to download the app, validate your pass and sign the waivers. All Dorna pass holders will be scanned in and out of the WorldSBK Paddock and can only do so by having a validated pass.

Please note that you do not need to upload your Covid Vaccination certificate for this event.

Pass Holders under the age of 18 will need to download the waivers within the email and present to Paddock Check In (Gate 2) for Pass validation.

#### 17. PIT FACILITIES

Each competitor in the Australian Superbike class will be allocated a 3m x 3m undercover marquee space in a temporary facility in the World Superbike Paddock as part of the entry fee; additional space is available for hire at the cost noted on Ridernet.

A 10-amp power outlet will be provided at each bay (i.e. two competitors to share each outlet). Competitors will need to provide their own equipment and lighting.

Each competitor in the Australian Supersport and Australian Supersport 300 categories will be allocated a section of a permanent shed in the National Paddock or a 3m x 3m undercover marquee bay if there is insufficient space, also located in the National Paddock.

**NOTE:** Without exception, ALL other competitors will not be permitted to enter the WorldSBK Paddock area with vehicles until the conclusion of ALL racing on Sunday.

Any electrical equipment brought into the venue must be 'tagged and tested' as evidence of compliance with the Australian Standard AS3760.

The WorldSBK Paddock will be open to event patrons on all three days of the event – roving security will be present however it is in your interest to secure your own belongings, particularly when you are out on track. The Promoter accepts no liability for lost or stolen goods. No Alcohol will be allowed in the WorldSBK Paddock.

All competitors should note that helmets must be worn at all times whilst riding motorcycles within the paddock and riding to and from the track. No scooters or bicycles are allowed to be ridden in the paddock area by ASBK competitors or team members.

#### 18. TIMING

The Promoter will provide timing transponders for all competitors. Competitors will be responsible for the care of their allocated transponder and for the cost of any repairs to or replacement of their allocated transponder if it is damaged or lost. The cost of a replacement transponder is \$600.

Transponders must be collected from the Race Secretary Office in the Control Tower prior to the first on track session.

#### **Transponder Deposit**

Transponder rental is included in the entry fee. No deposit needs to be paid at any time. Conditions apply below.

Failure to return a transponder at the conclusion of the event will make the user liable for rental or replacement costs.

# **Transponder Bracket**

Transponder mounting brackets are not provided with the rental transponders. Riders may purchase brackets from Computime when collecting transponders at a cost of \$12 inc GST (EFTPOS only) at the event.

# 23.4 FUEL STORAGE, AVAILABILITY & DISPOSAL

Details of fuel availability for the circuit will be outlined in the Final Instructions. No waste of any kind is to enter the storm-water drains in the paddock area. There are designated marked drums in the paddock area that are provided for waste oil and other fluid waste. Fuel waste disposal drums are not for used bike parts, tyres, oil filters etc.

Fuel is available for purchase at the Circuit.

For safety reasons, competitors may not store more than 60 litres of fuel within their pit area, and this must be stored in accordance with AS 1940 (dangerous goods storage and handling). Fuel may only be stored in containers approved to contain flammable liquids.

#### 24. FIRE EXTINGUISHERS

All teams must have a minimum 2kg, dry powder A:B (E) class, working fire extinguisher in their pit area

Once technical inspection has issued your tyre marking stickers it then becomes the responsibility of the rider/team to apply stickers as per instructions provided. Tyre stickers will be checked at random throughout the round at the discretion of the Series Chief Technical Officer.

The penalty for using an unmarked or non-homologated tyre in qualifying will be loss of the qualifying session's times. The penalty for using an unmarked or non-homologated tyre in a race will be exclusion from the results of the race.

Other penalties for non-compliance may apply at the discretion of the ASBK Race Direction.

All competitors will exit the track at Turn 12 – Pit Entry at the conclusion of races.

Prize money is inclusive of GST and any liability for GST or other taxes will be the responsibility of the recipient.

Competitors should note that unless they provide the Promoter with either their ABN or a declaration that the sport is their recreational pastime the Promoter is required to withhold 49% of prize money.

The Promoter will send prize money out to each rider after results are declared official. Appeals and drug testing results may mean there will be delays in payment.

#### 33. UNOFFICIAL PRACTICE

Unofficial practice will not be allowed at the Phillip Island Grand Prix Circuit for the period commencing 21 days prior to the event.

Due to the recently finished resurfacing works of the entire Phillip Island Grand Prix Circuit surface, plus the limited opportunity for teams & riders to test on this new surface, with the addition of no Official ASBK Test in 2024, the ASBK Management Team extends an Official Exemption of ASBK Sporting Regulation 2.6 (Unofficial Practice) to ALL ASBK teams and riders.

This Official Exemption allows practice, testing, or race activity at Phillip Island Grand Prix Circuit on  $2^{nd} - 4^{th}$  February.

All other Unofficial Practice or Testing at Phillip Island Grand Prix Circuit within 21 days for ASBK Rd.1 is NOT permitted, as per 2024 ASBK Sporting Regulation 2.6.

#### 39. WARNING

It is a condition of entry that entrants and riders (or guardian) indemnifies the land owners and occupiers, the organisers, the promoters, the sponsors, Motorcycling Australia (MA) their servants and officials, against any claims or liability for any damage loss or injury he or she may suffer arising in any way out of the competition. Where more than one signs the indemnity, they are liable each of them and all of them jointly.

The entrants and riders participate at his or her sole risk and responsibility. He or she accepts the track/venue as it stands with all shortcomings hidden or otherwise and the full knowledge that participation can be hazardous.

#### **40. CAMPING**

Bass Coast Shire regulations stipulate that camping is only permitted at the Phillip Island Grand Prix Circuit in the Trackside Campground. Contact Phillip Island Circuit for further information.

# **41. TRACK WALK**

The ASBK Track Walk (Track Familiarization) is scheduled for time will be advised in the Final Instructions. All riders will be given the opportunity to inspect the track on foot prior to commencement of the practice. Any queries regarding track safety should be taken up with the ASBK Clerk of Course or ASBK Race Direction. If the problem cannot be resolved to the satisfaction of the rider they may choose to withdraw from the meeting.

# **42. MEDIA GRIDS**

All Superbike and Supersport races will have a Media Grid for all races, refer to the ASBK Sporting Regulations 3.6 – Pre-Race Media Grids for further information.

No Media Grids will occur for Supersport 300 races at ASBK Rd.1.

Any equipment containing oil, water or fuel must not contaminate the track with fluids whilst being used. The only fluids allowed on the grid are drinks for riders which must be in a split proof container.

Re-fuelling of motorcycles is not allowed and no additional lubricants other than that which are contained within the motorcycle are permitted on the grid, this includes but is not limited to chain lubricants, brake fluid, engine oil or Non Glycol radiator coolant.

# 43. GARAGE / PITBOX SIGNAGE

All competitors are required to affix their name and class to the front of their pit box/carport/marquee at each round. Refer to ASBK Sporting Regulations 1.27.5.

# 44. MEDICAL INSPECTIONS / MA CONCUSSION GUIDELINES

All competitors are subject to adhere to the MA Concussion Guidelines which applies at all ASBK rounds. More details can be found at <a href="https://www.ma.org.au/medical-concussion">https://www.ma.org.au/medical-concussion</a>

Any rider may be requested to undergo a Medical Inspection at any time by the request of ASBK Race Direction or Chief Medical Officer. Failure to comply will result in the suspension of the MA license of the rider, and other penalties may be applied by ASBK Race Direction.
